Politics & Power is a bi-annual series of articles, surveys, reviews and discussions focussing on the problems and possibilities for socialist strategy in Britain. As a forum for serious and fruitful debate, it is intended to draw together socialists from a range of intellectual and political perspectives in sustained analyses of the political, economic and social questions facing the British Left.

The aim of the project is to identify new solutions to the problems which confront socialists in Britain, and particularly how to move out of the political ghetto in which the left has isolated itself, and begin to develop strategies both relevant and feasible in current conditions. What makes this project necessary is that the Left in Britain is weak, disunited and has little political impact. What makes it possible is the widespread dissatisfaction throughout the left with existing socialist policies, organisations, and politics.

The editorial board of *Politics & Power* comprises people with diverse intellectual and political backgrounds: members of the Labour and Communist parties, non-aligned socialists, trade union activists, and feminists committed to the currently central and complex task of developing a coherent socialist feminist politics.
