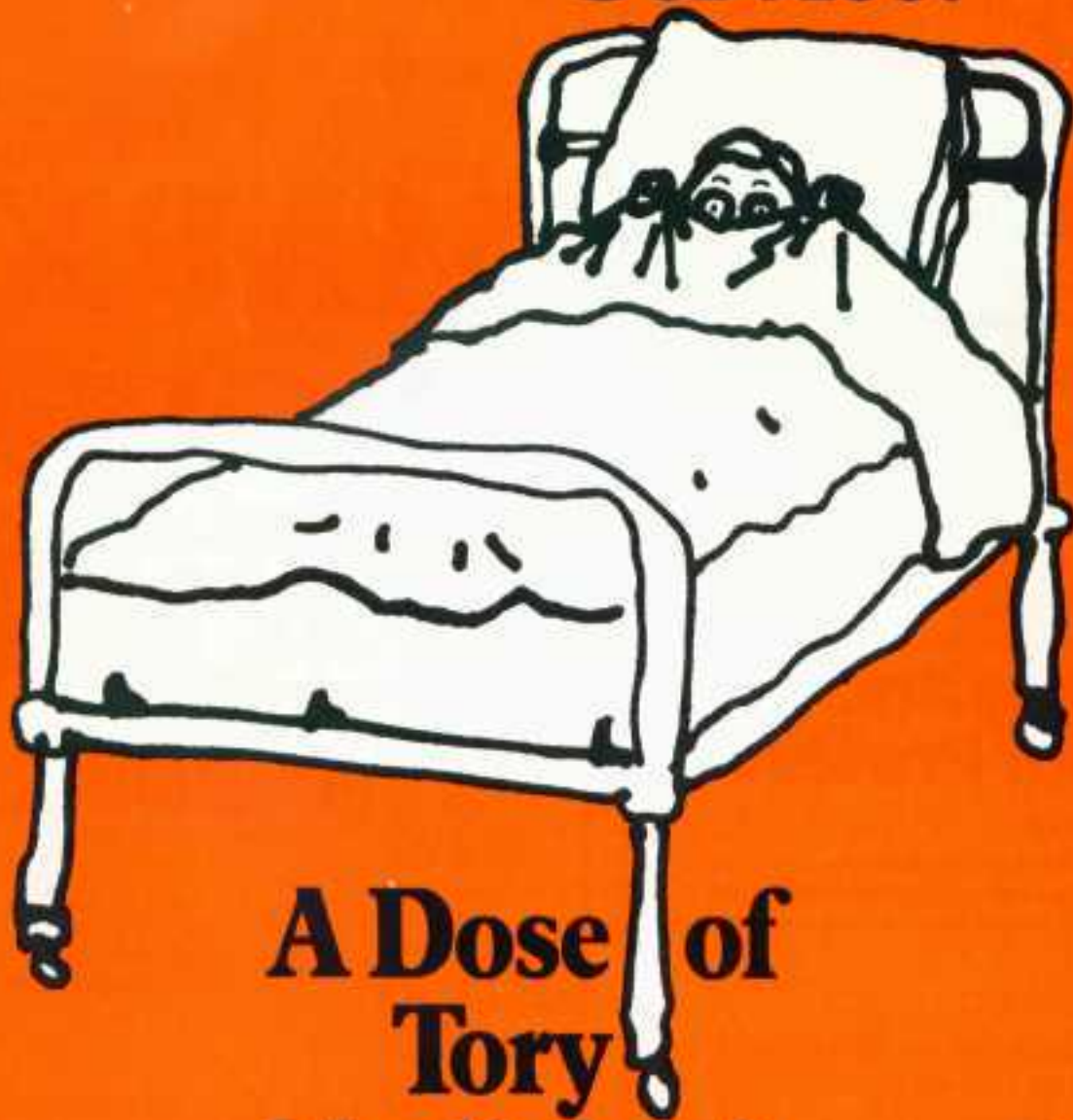

Evgeny Bronislavovich Pashukanis (1891-1937) was the prodigious author of some two hundred pieces on questions of legal theory, legal history and public administration. This book provides the first comprehensive selection in English translation from the writings of this most prominent Soviet legal philosopher. Eleven of Pashukanis' major theoretical writings, including the original Russian edition of "The General Theory of Law and Marxism" (1924) have been translated into English for the first time and incorporated into this volume.
