3 *Black Jacobins* by C. L. R. James £2.20 (4.95). Classic account of the slave revolt in Haiti led by Toussaint L'Ouverture.

4 *Voices for Withdrawal of Conscience for Withdrawal in Ireland* 80p (1.75). A collection of writings for a British withdrawal.

5 *Women and Russia* Women & Eastern Europe Group £1.30 (1.75). Complete translation of a new Russian feminist magazine subsidised by KGB.
