WILLIAM MORRIS'S SOCIALIST DIARY

introduction, annotation and biographical notes on his companions by Florence Boos, University of Iowa.

Published here for the first time in complete form William Morris's Diary for the period January to April 1887 offers a graphic account of his work as a socialist activist: street corner meetings in London, extensive propaganda tours in the North of England and Scotland. An excellent introduction to Morris's political beliefs, it also documents the doctrinal and tactical disputes within the socialist movement during this formative period.

The Diary is supplemented with over fifty biographical sketches of the prominent contemporaries who crowd Morris's pages, among them: Annie Besant, Jean Hippolyte Colins, Fred Henderson, H.M. Hyndman, Frank Kitz, Peter Kropotkin, Paul Lafargue, Jenny Morris, Andreas Scheu, George Bernard Shaw and James Tochatti.
