## HAS SOCIALISM A FUTURE?

The New flight has made big gains in British and international politics since the mid-1970s. It's clear that the growth of mass unemployment and the world recession has not produced an automatic swing to the left. 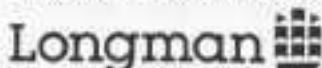
