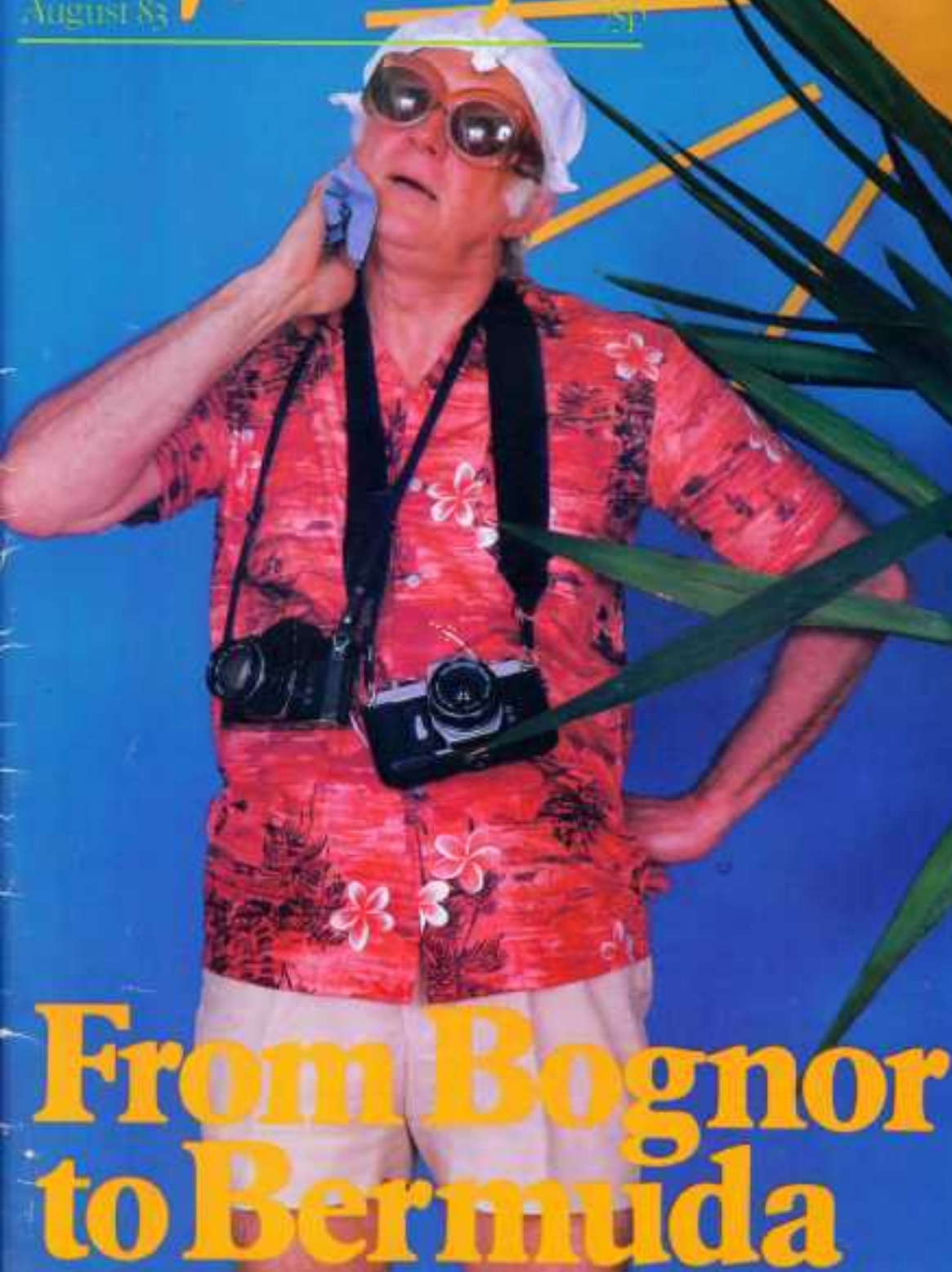

Yet business landlords continue to find legal methods of exploitation. Based on the author's own research, the book describes the range of malpractices by landlords, the reasons for the different official responses to them and the underlying constraints which shape legislative interference with commercial behaviour and property ownership in capitalist societies.

A main aim of the book is to analyse the effect of a system of forced commerce upon a backward economy, with particular reference to the Indian sub-continent.
