

WHOSE WORLD IS THE WORLD?

This set of posters provides a historical perspective for teaching in the multi-cultural school. There are twelve each printed in three colours and measuring 20" x 28". They form a coherent set but are designed so that they can be presented one by one or in groups. They have been produced primarily for use across the age range in secondary schools and in Liberal Studies courses in colleges of further education.

The posters present history as experienced by workers, peasants and slaves rather than as the story of heroes and kings. They put forward ways of understanding why there is an unequal distribution of wealth throughout the world. They show how the question of racism cannot be separated from the world-wide development of Western economic power over the last 400 years.
