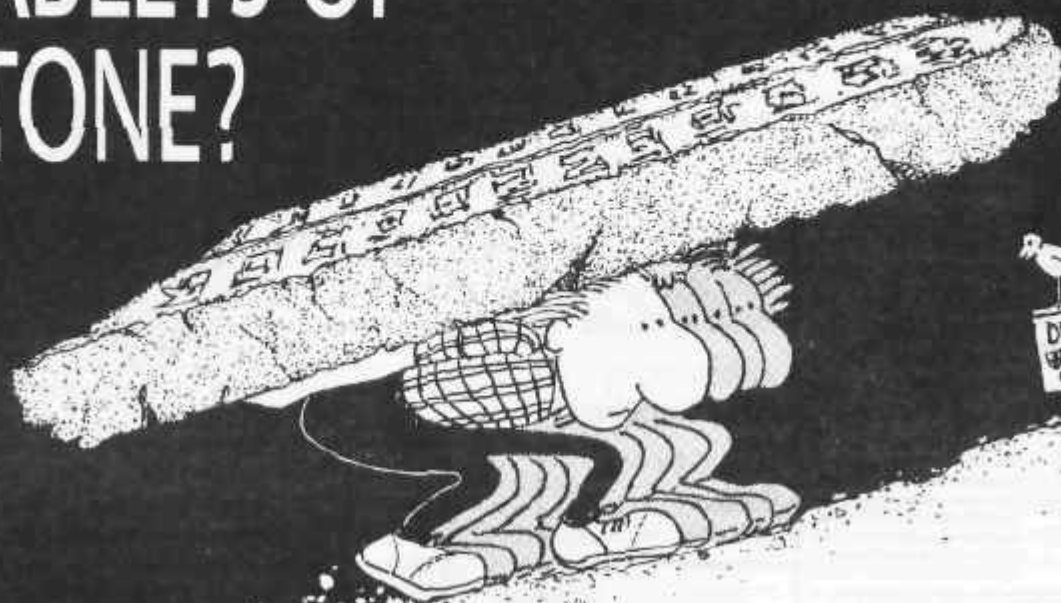


TABLETS OF STONE?


More Cruise Missiles?

- the political economy of the USSR

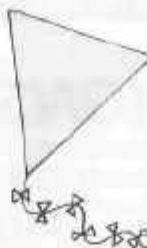
The course fee is £124 a session. Entry is open to both economics graduates and social science graduates. For economics graduates the course lasts two and a half years, the final six months of which is spent completing work for the dissertation. Social science graduates who have not specialised in economics take a preliminary one-year course before proceeding to the MA proper.

The course is taught Monday and Tuesday evenings at the Polytechnic's Enfield location in north London.

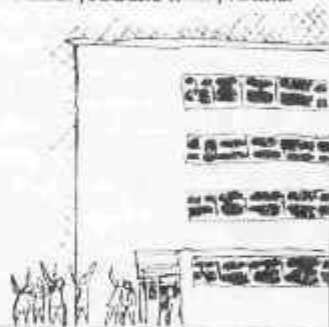
