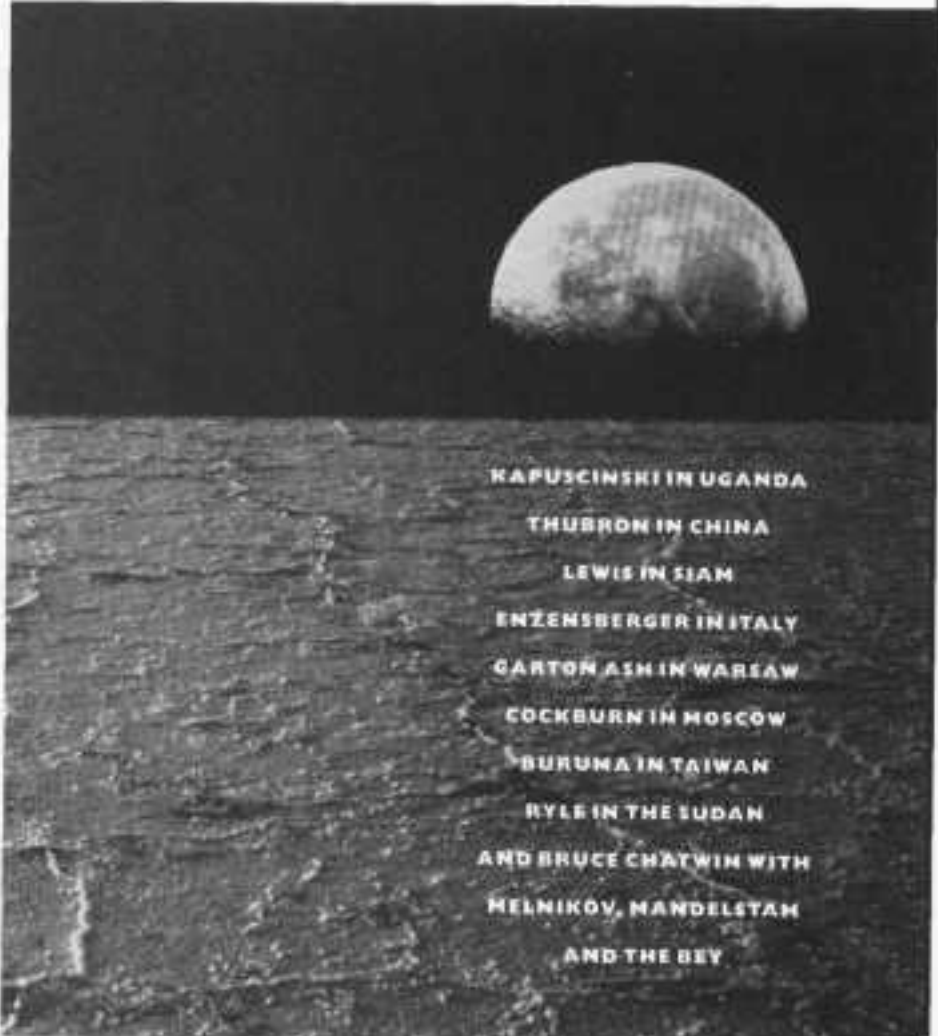

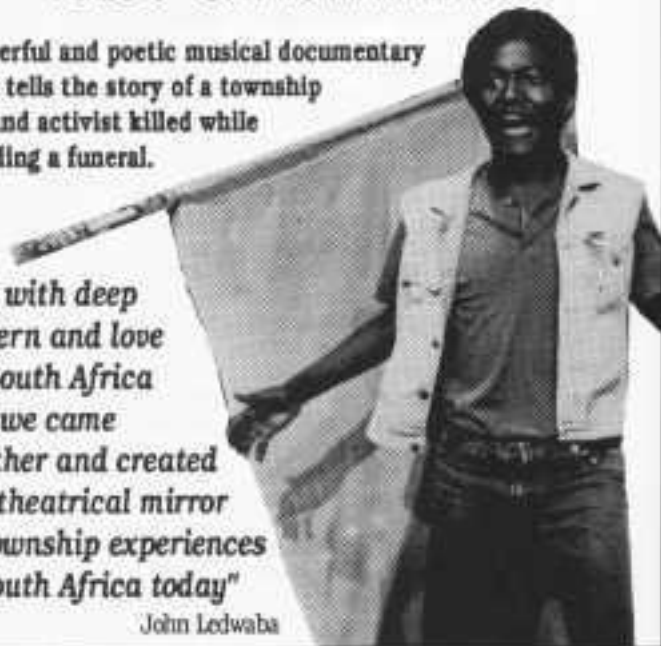

Policing in Hackney is the result of a unique investigation into the mysterious and controversial death of a young Black man, Colin Roach, in an East London police station in 1983 and the historical Black experience of oppressive policing in one London borough (Hackney).

The investigation was conducted by an independent committee of inquiry established by a Black campaign group: the Roach Family Support Committee. RFSC was formed in 1983 to campaign for an independent public inquiry into Colin Roach's death. Prior to a coroner's inquest this death has been defined by the Metropolitan police and the national media as 'suicide'. Contesting this definition was the principle objective of the campaign (1983-1988). Policing in Hackney contains the inquiry's own researches and previously unpublished material. The end result is an assiduous analysis of the Black experience of policing in the London Borough of Hackney. This includes a detailed examination of the contradictions and disturbing anomalies in 'official' explanations of a particular police related death. This book represents a devastating rejoinder to the official 'top down' explanations of police/Black people encounters in the blighted urban terrain known as the inner-city.

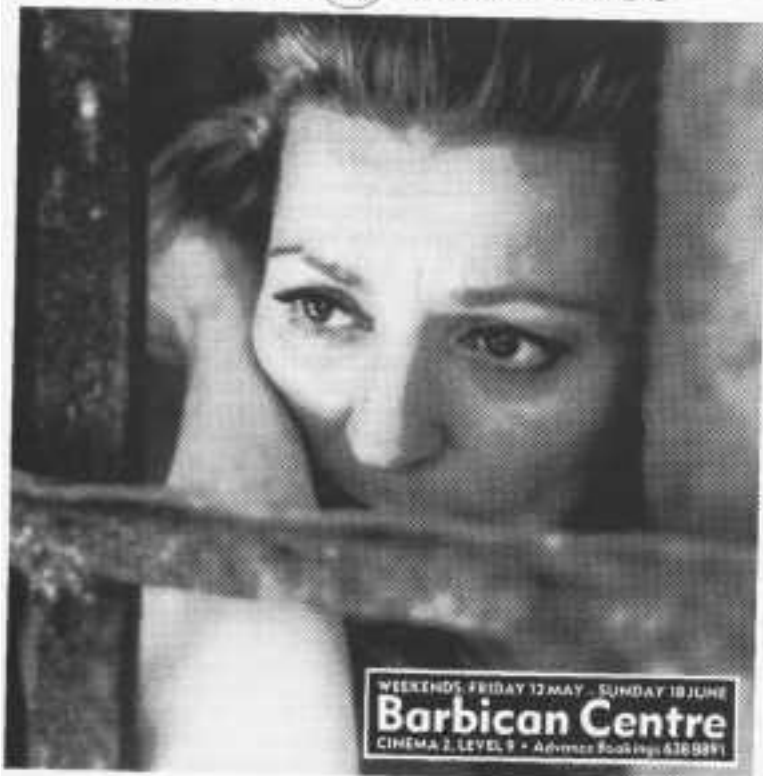

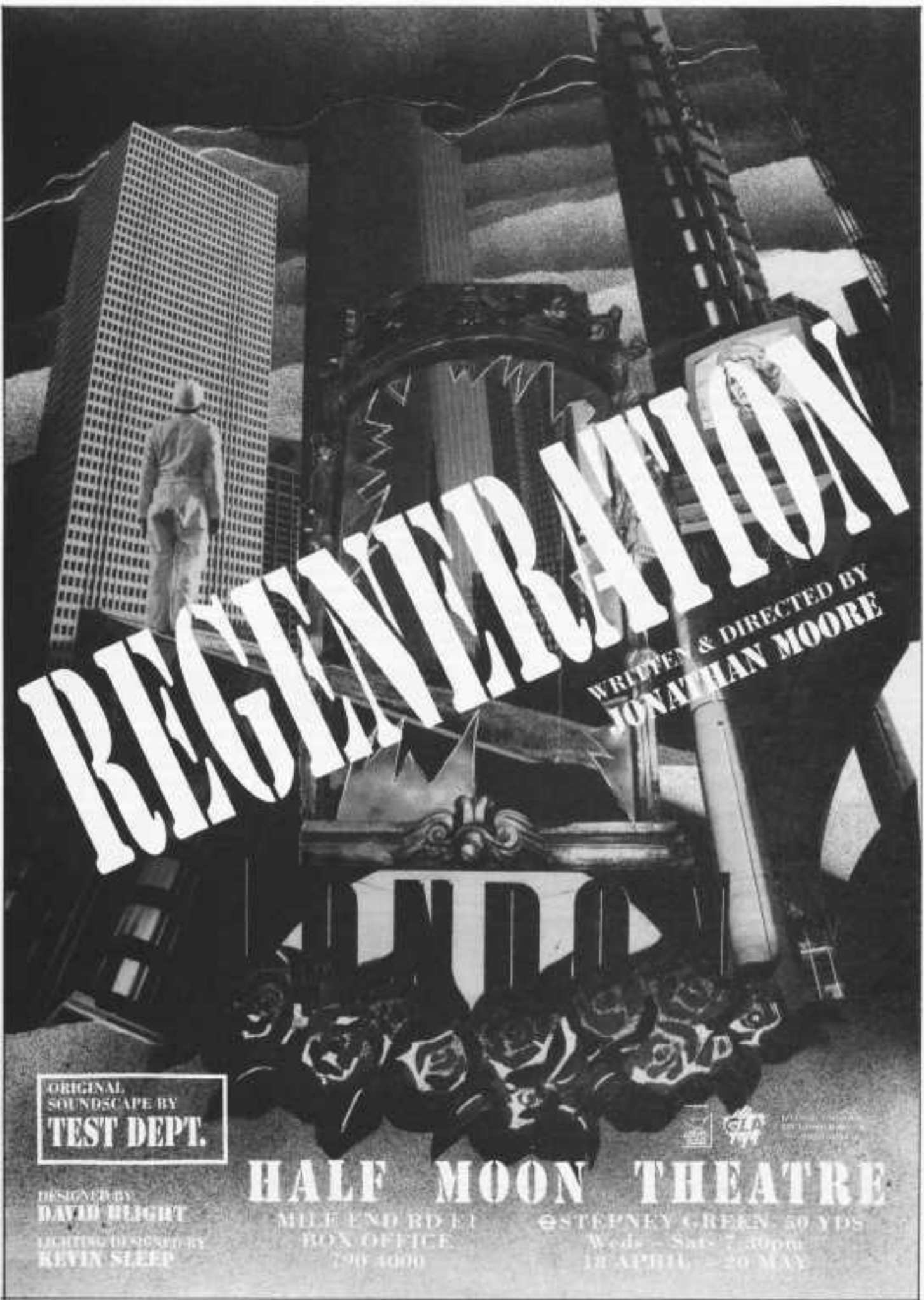
