

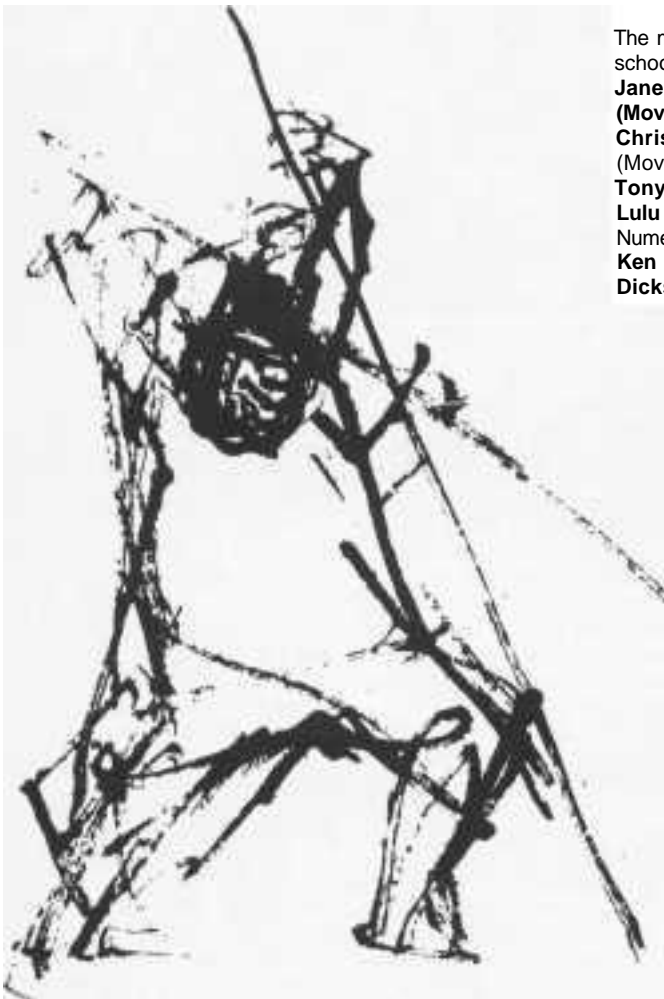
The Poor School

The Poor School (Registered Charity No: 299619) offers a two year acting training scheduled entirely in the evenings and at weekends. The hours worked are equivalent to a full time training but students are free to retain employment during the day and thus support themselves. The training is especially suitable therefore for aspirant actors without prospect of a grant and with limited resources.

The school gained charitable status through its policy of charging cost to students; no profit is made from fees.

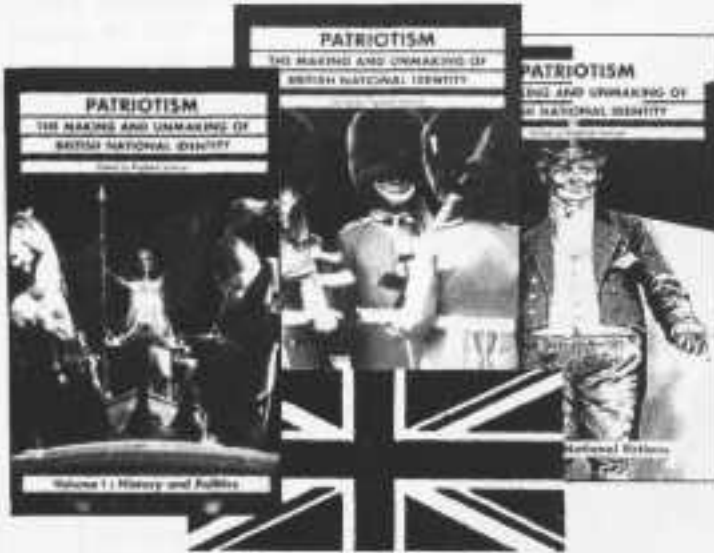
